6a. Module Description
<p>This module introduces you to the development of Victorian Britain. You will examine changes in politics and social structure, focusing in particular on the development of the party political system as well as class, gender, sexuality and the economy. Key political and social figures such as Robert Peel, Florence Nightingale, Queen Victoria and William Gladstone will be examined. There is an emphasis on the emergence of liberalism and on Victorian Britain as a liberal society. The module employs a combination of lectures and seminars. Teamwork and oral skills are promoted through group discussion during seminars, and this helps to prepare you for employment as it encourages interaction with colleagues. The module will deepen your analytical skills by focusing on more complex arguments than at Level 4. It will also develop your ability to engage in autonomous learning and problem solving, thereby preparing you for Level 6.</p>
