You'll also have the opportunity to critically appraise the ethical dimensions of research studies that seek to develop, improve and advance service delivery.

* Concept of research based practice. * Research methodology - different approaches to research. * Explore the ambiguities and limits in knowledge. * Research process, key research and statistical terms. * A comparison of qualitative and quantitative research data within health and/or social studies settings. * Analysis of statistical and/or non-statistical data. * Scientific rigour - reliability, validity/trustworthiness. * Research governance and ethical consideration. * Utilising research into the health or social studies setting. * Evaluation of existing research and the evidence base for policy and practice. * Critical analysis skills in relation to research topics.
