Coursework: Submission of an e-portfolio and personal statement. For the personal statement students should reflect on their development as a public health practitioner over the course and self-appraise the areas and skills that they will continue to acquire as a graduate public health practitioner. The statement should incorporate the UKPHR Public Health Practitioner Standards (8 steps to practitioner)

In order to pass this module, students are required to achieve an overall mark of 40% (for modules at levels 3, 4, 5 and 6) or 50% (for modules at level 7*).

In addition, students are required to:

- (a) achieve the qualifying mark for each element of fine graded assessment as specified above
- (b) pass any pass/fail elements
