LEARNING, TEACHING AND ASSESSMENT INFORMATION

6a. Module Description

The module provides you with the opportunity to select an area within Sport and Exercise Science, Sport Coaching and Physical Education, Coaching for Performance in Football, Coaching for Development in Football, Sport and Exercise Therapy or Strength and Conditioning with Rehabilitation and to determine and apply ethical standards, undertake an in-depth review

of the literature, and create a research question derived from the review. Furthermore, this module provides an opportunity to develop, conceptualise, execute, analyse and reflect upon your own independent research.

The module is supported by 12 hours of taught sessions where project management and development will be addressed. Additionally, a nominal 12 hours are allocated for personal supervision during the module.

6b. Outline Content

The specific content will depend very much on the field of study and will be determined in consultation with the allocated supervisors. However all projects must contain an extensive review of the literature which details a method used for the attainment and dissemination of the findings and includes a review of the research design.
