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## 6a. Module Description

This module intends to introduce students to some of the key principles within medical and healthcare education. The module will encourage the student to reflect upon their experiences, both as a learner and as an educator, to develop and enhance their own teaching practices in light of those principles explored, incorporating critical analysis of relevant literature. The module will address practical aspects of teaching, from motivating learners through to designing effective learning resources to enhance their teaching strategies and will provide guidance on planning, delivering and reflecting on teaching sessions to maximise the quality of the learning experience.

Face-to-face delivery will be across five 'workshops' with further complementary resources and activities available online. Distance learners will have further resources and activities online which will be complimented with five webinars. The overall aims of this module are:

\* To critically enhance students understanding and implementation of principles of learning and teaching in relation to their target group.
