6a. Module Description

Mobilities and Migration helps you to understand how peoples' mobilities and migration shape and have shaped societies and individual lives in a current and historical context. You will explore different migration movements across nation-state borders such as the Syrian refugee crisis, EU migration, the 'Windrush Generation' and the Kindertransport. This module focuses, in particular, on nation-states' immigration policies and the effect these policies have on migrants' rights and experiences. You will learn about different theoretical frameworks for the analysis of nation-states' responses to migration movements, which will equip you with skills to evaluate migration policies. You will be introduced to different local, national and international organisations and networks which deal with migration and integration and offer opportunities for volunteering, internships and/or employment.
