LEARNING, TEACHING AND ASSESSMENT INFORMATION

6a. Module Description

This module runs over two trimesters and introduces you to the printmaking facilities in Cambridge School of Art.

As well as learning new technical skills and processes, you will learn how to use equipment and technical equipment in a safe manner. This means that for future projects and modules, you will be able to work independently and securely in the printmaking area during open access sessions. This module deals with the relationship between print processes and the specialist area of Illustration. You are invited to explore the application of graphic processes and media both through your own creative practice and through exposure to contemporary and historical examples. Seminars on reprographic processes and possibilities are augmented by studio projects and demonstrations, with a particular emphasis on the historical and contemporary relationships between print as a method of mass reproduction, and printmaking as a contemporary medium for illustration. The module is delivered in the illustration studio and print workshops and students are encouraged to make use of open access time in the print workshops.

A basic introduction to hand bookbinding is included.
