LEARNING, TEACHING AND ASSESSMENT INFORMATION

6a. Module Description

The module introduces you to techniques for developing and sustaining creative writing and teaches you how to practice these techniques in your own short fiction, poetry and dramatic writing. There is an emphasis on analysing imaginative texts to understand what makes them effective for different audiences and on practical writing exercises. Practical work addresses the processes, content, structure and formal features of imaginative writing genres. You will be given guidance on making use of journals and notebooks, on reading widely to inform creative writing practice and on engaging in constructive criticism. As the module progresses, you will explore the special techniques and conventions of writing short fiction, poetry and dramatic writing.

Using critical skills developed through wide reading and from workshop analysis, you will re-draft your own work and produce a critical commentary evaluating the creative processes that you have pursued, analysing specific techniques used in your portfolio of imaginative writing, and identifying areas for future development.

6b. Outline Content

- Analysis of imaginative texts to identify effective writing techniques.
- · Creative writing practice in short fiction, poetry and dramatic writing.
- · Consideration of audience.
- Presentation of work to fellow students, offering and receiving constructive criticism.
- Maintaining reading journals and writing notebooks.
- Redrafting of creative work following formative feedback.
- · Critical evaluation of creative processes and finished works.
