6a. Module Description

This module will provide you with a current snapshot of UK health and social care services and the key aspects of pursuing a career within them. The module will introduce you to the challenges and opportunities that a career in health and social care services presents today.

You will have an introduction to the health and social care sector in the UK on this module, as well as an overview of current affairs within and affecting the sector. You will develop knowledge and understanding of the core values of the National Health Service (NHS), the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC), the Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC), and Social Work England (SWE).

This module will provide you with an opportunity to apply theory and develop skills of professional practice, as well as provide an opportunity to develop written and verbal communication skills in line with the requirements of the health and social care professional and regulatory bodies. There will also be opportunities for you to develop interpersonal skills in preparation for a career within health and social care services, and improve your presentation and interview techniques.
